Presidential History

1. C. Abraham Lincoln- referring to the Republican party's promise to support legislation granting free homesteads to settlers of the Western frontier.
2. A. 2- Thomas Jefferson and John Adams
3. A. Grover Cleveland- In June 1886, he took 21-year-old Frances Folsom as his wife, making him the first President to be married in the White House. He was also the first President to have a child born there.
4. C. Warren G. Harding- happened in 1889
5. B. Martin Van Buren- born in Kinderhook, New York, in 1782
6. C. 3-John Adams and Thomas Jefferson died within a few hours of each other on July 4, 1826 and James Monroe died on July 4, 1831.
7. B. John Adams- Although George Washington oversaw the construction of the house, he never lived in it. It was not until 1800, when the White House was nearly completed, that its first residents, President John Adams and his wife Abigail, moved in.
8. C. Franklin D. Roosevelt- The first President to appear on black and white television was Franklin D. Roosevelt on April 30, 1939 at the opening ceremonies for the World's Fair.

9. A. Franklin D Roosevelt- he is the only President of the United States to serve more than two terms in office. In response to this unprecedented achievement, the 22nd Amendment limiting Presidential terms was passed by Congress in 1947 and ratified by the states in 1951.
10. C. Theodore Roosevelt- was 42 years and 10 months old when he was inaugurated on September 14, 1901.
11. B. James Madison- was the shortest President at 5 ft 4 in (163 cm)
12. A. Grover Cleveland- he served two non-consecutive terms and is counted chronologically as both the twenty-second and the twenty-fourth president.
13. A. John F. Kennedy-The four presidents on Mount Rushmore are George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln.
14. C. Abraham Lincoln- At 6 ft 3 3/4 in, Abraham Lincoln surmounts Lyndon B. Johnson as the tallest president.
